There has been no doubt that 2023 has been an extremely difficult for all, especially participants in Harness Racing. With the ever-increasing living costs, interest rates escalating and stake money reducing, it has been hard for all and I offer my congratulations to all who have made it through. Almost daily we are hearing of people leaving the industry, breeding numbers down and return on investment being lower and lower. It has been nothing but gloom and doom and recent meetings with HRV has not painted a pretty picture. Just a read of HRV's annual report shows exactly where the industry is. BUT we, as a kindred body, must continue to work with HRV to assist in forming a pathway forward. We must assist with planning, programming and finding any roses among the pit of what we shovel every day. We must meet, discuss and plan for our future, otherwise we as an industry will not have a future. We will participate in Harness Racing Advisory Council, HRV planning subcommittees and the forecast programming subcommittee. Even the cost analysis survey that many members completed has made HRV more and more aware of the costs involved in maintaining, training and racing the standard-bred. This VSTA initiative has been one of the centre-pieces of the cost analysis by Ernst-

For the VSTA, 2023 has been a year of consolidation and re-building. The consolidation of our committee to be cohesive, positive, hard-working and supportive of each other with the same ideals – promoting the trotter.

I would like to thank the committee for all of their hard work and commitment.

We have had to rebuild fractured relationships with HRV and other kindred bodies. Meeting with HRV in a positive manner, assisting and continued dialogue with programming. As part of HRV's cost cutting, they have had to reduce stake money and the VSTA will continue to fight for the 'lower-end' of stake money to be at least maintained and when the situation improves, then stake money can also improve.

The VSTA has been and continue to be involved in meetings with other kindred bodies and government departments about the current state of Harness Racing in Victoria. Although is has been depressing, we must keep working towards the end goal of survival.

This year has been successful on many fronts for the VSTA.

The Redwood Carnival was again a great success and congratulations to the Maryborough Harness Racing Club, Jackson Barby and Les Chapman

The Stallion Raffle was an outstanding success. A big thankyou to Haras des Trotteurs, Pat Driscoll and Louise Toulmin for sponsoring and arranging the stallion services.

Also thankyou to all the ticket sellers and especially everyone who bought a ticket. Money raised through this fund raiser will be used to support our members in various ways. Again, the committee would welcome any suggestions going forward.

FEATURE RACES

REDWOOD CARNIVAL ROUND-UP

OVERSEAS and interstate visitors walked with the biggest prizes of Redwood Day at Maryborough on Sunday, October 29.

Queenslander Not As promised (trained by Graham Dwyer/driven by Nathan Dawson) conquered the thereyear-olds in the Group 1 \$75,000 El Titan @ Haras des Trotteurs Victoria Trotters Derby, 2690m.

The son of Betting Line scored by a short half head from Prince Of Rock (Daryl Crone/Tina Ridis), with The Locomotive (Wayne Potter/Nathan Jack) third.

It was the gelding's second Victorian start after a fourth in a derby heat - giving him a career record of 7 wins in 13 starts.

New Zealander High Step (Mark and Nathan Purdon/ Greg Sugars) ran away with the Group 2 \$50,000 Aldebaran Park Red Wood Classic for 2yos, 2190m, by an emphatic 8m.

Nordic Reign (John and Matt Newberry) was second, with Linked in Bio (Alison Duggan/Josh Duggan) third.

By Father Patrick US, High Step is out of outstanding raceme High Gat, which won the 2015 Redwood Classic and has produced three winners from three foals to race.

CHAMPION stallion Majestic Son was the leading sire over the two-day carnival.

3yo gelding Soso Majestic broken his maiden status on the Friday, and 8yo gelding Majestic Connies NZ and 5yo gelding Hadtobeharry saluted on the Sunday.

Sebastian K Swe and Aldebaran Eagle US each had two wins.

All up 17 sires had winners, also hailing from the United States, French, Finland, Australia and New Zealand

FRENCH-bred sire Up And Quick had his first Australian-bred winner, with colt Phoenix Red (trained by Steve Loftus) taking out the Worlds Best Hoof Oil 2yo Maiden Trot on debut.

He was the first of Up And Quick's 17 Australian foals to race.

Up And Quick (by Buvetier D'Aunou) is a half-brother to Ganymede Fra - the sire of prominent Australian-bed sire Peak Dnk and Australian-bred group 1 winner Vincennes.

WAGON Apollo broodmare Sosoclassy produced a double on the Friday.

3yo gelding Soso Majestic (Majestic Son Ca) won the Garry Angus Memorial Maiden Trot for trainers Chris and Sonia Mahar and 5yo gelding Sosomaori (Wind Cries Maori NZ) saluted in the Elaine Angus Maiden Trott for Michael Gadsden.

Sosoclassy has had four foals to the races for four winers.

She was classy racemare, winning 11 races Including the 2006 group 1 Victoria Trotters Oaks) for \$111,962

Wagon Apollo was also the broodmare sire of 6yo mare Montana Muscle, which was also also winner of the Friday program.

VIC COUNTRY CUP SERIES

ONE OVER ALL LEADS CHAMPIONSHIP

One Over All leads the Maori's Idol Trotting Championship with a month of the season to go.

He has had four wins, two seconds and a third from nine Victorian country trotting cup starts.

This gives the Jess Tubbs-trained five-year-old 30 points in the race for \$50,000 in bonuses.

Victree Hill is next best on 21 points.

Since the start of October, the NZ-bred One Over All has added to his talk with a second in the Swan Hill Cup and third in Geelong's McNamara Cup.

His 2023 country cups victories have come at Horsham, Charlton, Ararat and Maryborough.

TROTTING STALLION FEATURE

E L TITAN YEARLINGS IN HIGH DEMAND

Yearlings by Haras Des Trotteurs' new trotting stallion E L Titan 1:51.4 (\$726,344) were keenly sought by buyers at last week's Black Book Sale at Harrisburg, Pennsylvania.

There were four youngsters by the young Muscle Hill horse sent through the ring and they averaged out at \$60,500, the sixth highest average for a trotting sire.

An E L Titan filly, Killemwithkindness, realised \$100,000 and a colt, Wordplay Blue Chip, sold for \$67,000.

E L Titan's average put him ahead of established sires such as Credit Winner, Muscle Mass, Father Patrick, Tactical Landing, Cantab Hall and Trixton.

E L Titan, who is standing his first Australian season at Cobbitty Equine Farm in NSW, has sired the winners of \$11.3million in North America to date including \$2.6million this year.

Bred in Finland, E L Titan raced solely in America and was a Stakes winner as a two, three and fouryear-old. He finished in the money in 16 of his 20 lifetime starts. E L Titan is one of the most fashionably bred trotting sires available to 'down under' breeders, being by the mighty Muscle Hill from the same family as the leading sires Conway Hall, Angus Hall, Andover Hall and so on.

The brilliant, young stallion has attracted almost 90 bookings in his introductory season at a fee of \$3,500 plus GST.

BREEDERS CROWN ROUND UP

US-bred stallion Volstead further enhanced an already outstanding first season for his progeny on the track with a Breeders Crown double at Melton on Saturday, November 25.

Val Thorens took out the 2yo trotting colts and geldings final and Nordic Reign saluted in the 2yo trotting fillies final.

Haras des Trotteurs stood Volstead in his first season at stud in Australia.

The son of Cantab Hall has had nine winners in Australia.

Queensland 3yo gelding Not As Promised completed the Victoria Trotters Derby-Breeders Crown double and 3yo filly Rockinwithattitude had her fourth group 1 victory.







TROTTING STALLION FEATURE

PEAK TO THE SIRE FOREFRONT

The Danish bred horse Peak, who later raced successfully in New Zealand and is now standing at Mountain View Stud near Ballarat, is proving one of the quiet achievers of the Australasian trotting scene.

This season the dual Group 1 winning son of Ganymede has sired 22 individual winners in Australia and \$495,238 in stakes and 18 winners in NZ for \$331,519 and is ranked among the Top Ten sires in both countries.

Heading the vanguard in Australia for Peak are the Menangle Trotters Cup victor Doff Your Cap, the Group 3 Albion Park winner Funny Face and the NSW Foundation and Canberra Cup winner Jungle Eyes.

He has also left a string of metropolitan winners including Racing Eyes and Queen Of Strathfield (Menangle), Perfect Peak (Melton), Top Of The Moment and Set Me Free (Albion Park), Sir Ed (Globe Derby Park) and Elegant Peak (Gloucester Park).

In New Zealand, Peak has sired this season's

Group 3 winner Rosie, Vertigo (4 wins) and the Group 1 Great Northern Derby placegetter Aardie's Peak.

All told, Peak has left 17 Australian bred winners from 21 starters - an amazing strike rate.

Congratulations to Tina Ridis, the latest recipient of the VSTA Member Recognition Award. Tina has been a member of the VSTA for over 10 years, including a period of time as a member of excutive committee. Tina is riding the crest of a wave at the moment, winning races with Chantilly Dee, Prince of Rock (including heat and final in the Nutriens 3-Y-O Trotters Classic, 3rd in the heat and final of VicBred Super Series and an agonisingly 'nose' second in the Haras des Trotteurs Derby), Rastamon and places with her favourite horse – Mumstheword.

Tina has been around the harness racing industry her whole life, with her father owning, training and driving during her childhood. Tina states that her favourite track is Lord's Raceway Bendigo, despite the finding it a difficult track to have success on.

Not considering herself as superstitious person, Tina never wears green when racing and always ensures she has clean driving pants for every meeting.

Looking forward, Tina hopes to see changes to the handicapping system and increases to prizemoney in harness racing. She wishes to see an improvement to the current programming structures and to ensure that all horses have a fair and equal opportunity to race competitively.



Personally, Tina hopes to be able to consistently achieve success with her team.
